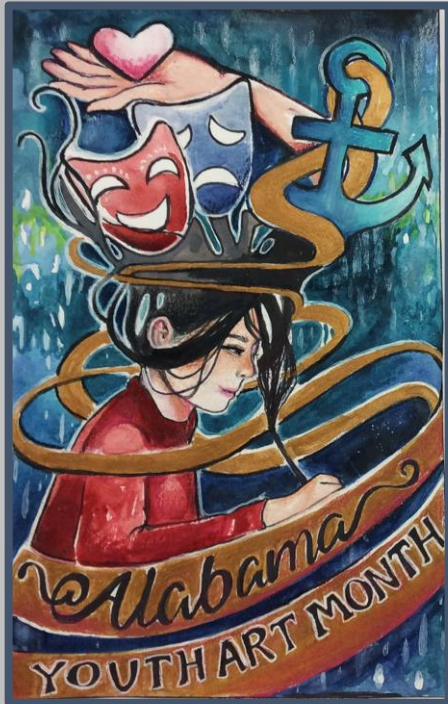

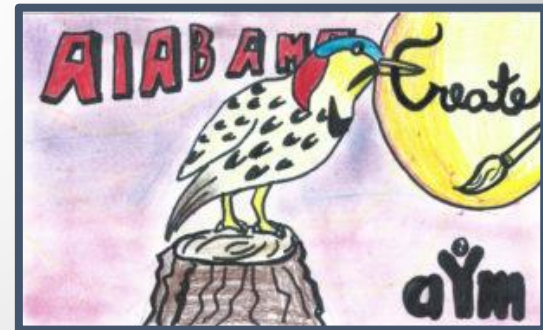

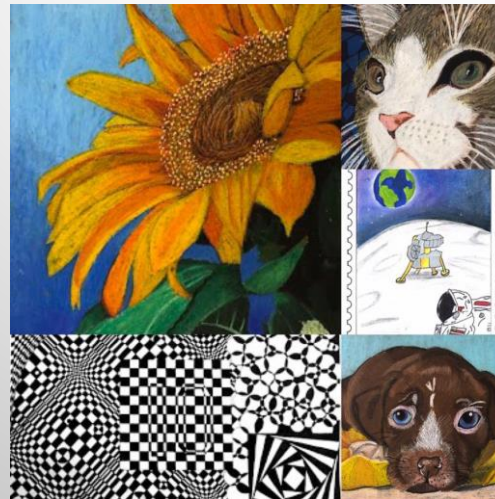

Huntsville Museum of Art Youth Art Month (YAM) 2019 Report

The Huntsville Museum of Art participated in *Youth Art Month* by doing the following:

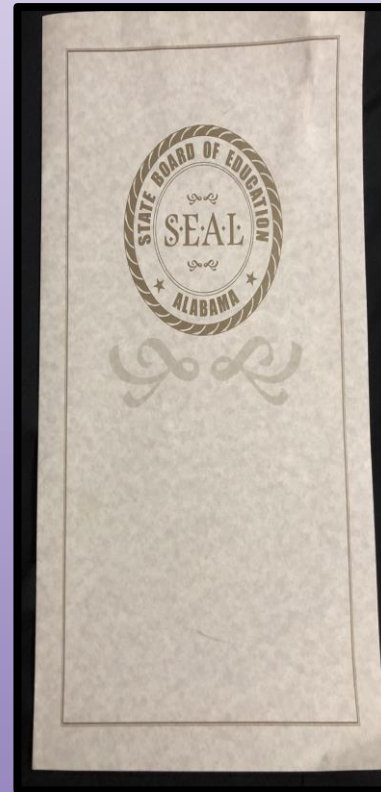
- I. Installed an exhibition in the Adtran, Jurenko, Thurber and Women's Guild galleries, which lasted from March 10 through April 28, 2019 – 32nd annual *YAM: Exhibition for Youth Art Month*.
- 169 pieces of student artwork were displayed.
- Students represented 95 schools from: Huntsville City (Public and Private), Madison City, Madison County, Athens City, Limestone County, Decatur City, and Scottsboro City. Art teachers are responsible for selecting the artwork for YAM.
- Media included painting, drawing, clay, papier-mâché mixed media, ceramic, collage, and more.
- Each piece was framed by Museum volunteers, docents, art teachers, members of the Huntsville-Madison County Art Education Association, du Midi members and Juniorettes. The frames are the property of the Museum.
- Each piece had a label created for it, which included student's name, school, title, medium used, and teacher's name.
- Opening day for the *Youth Art Month* exhibition included a reception for parents, art teachers and student artists. Over 962 people attended this reception. The Huntsville Museum Board of Directors sponsored the reception. Assistance provided by the art teachers, duMidi members. Also artists' demonstrations – Anna Sue Courtney (puppetry arts), Carolyn Dodson-Grimm (acrylic painting), S. Renee Prasil (sculpture) and Linda Ruhl (watercolor painting).
- Printed invitation was mailed to officials: Huntsville City Council members, mayors of Huntsville, Madison, Decatur, and Scottsboro, Madison County Commissioners, and Limestone County Commissioners, and Alabama State Legislators.
- Printed invitation was mailed to the Museum membership, art teachers, principals, school board members, students, and regional educational institutions.
- Certificates signed by the Museum Executive Director and Director of Education/Museum Academy were given to each student whose artwork was on display.
- Major support for *YAM 2019* programs is generously provided by: Presenting Sponsor - TOYOTA Motor Manufacturing, Alabama, Inc. and Exhibition Sponsors – Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Alabama, Joyce Griffin, Courtney and John Allen and Walmart.
- Additional support provided by: The Alabama State Council on the Arts, Alabama Arts Alliance and the Huntsville Museum of Art Guild.
- In-kind amount from the museum was close to \$5,900.
- The Alabama State Council on the Arts (ASCA) provided \$400 stipend for the *Visual Arts Achievement (VAA)* Program exhibition and related educational programs. *Pic-A-Frame* provided in-kind mats for the VAA artwork.

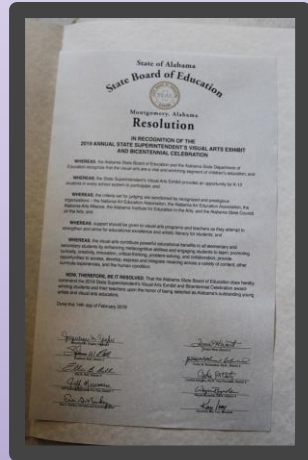

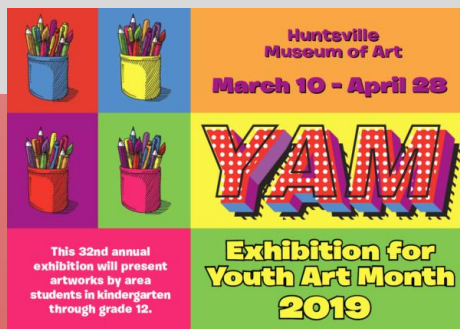
Museum to celebrate 32nd Annual Youth Art Month

Artwork from area students in Huntsville City, Madison City, Madison County, Athens City, Limestone County, Decatur City and Scottsboro City will be on display.

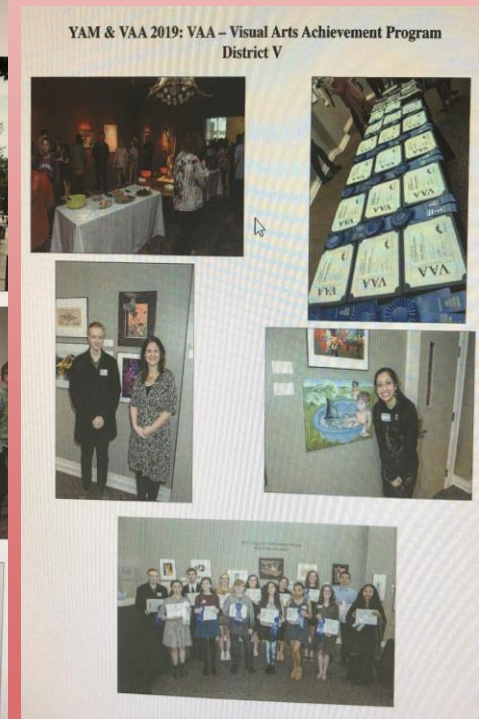
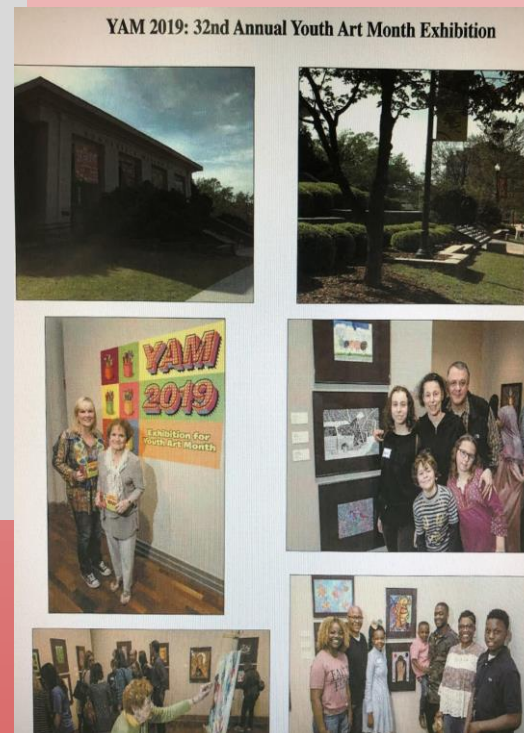
“The *YAM 2019: Exhibition for Youth Art Month* demonstrates the creativity and collaboration of the talented youth whose artwork emphasizes the quality arts in education programs in North Alabama,” said Laura E. Smith, Director of Education/Museum Academy at HMA. “Join us as we celebrate the month of March as Youth Art Month – Museum visitors will have the opportunity to view portraits, landscapes and still-lives done in a variety of media from drawing, painting, ceramics and mixed media.”

On view in the Guild Gallery at HMA from March 10 through April 28 will be the *Congressional Art Competition*’s winning piece that will be chosen from Congressman Mo Brooks’ 5th District. At the end of its display at HMA, the piece will be sent to Washington, D.C. for a year-long display at the U.S. Capitol.

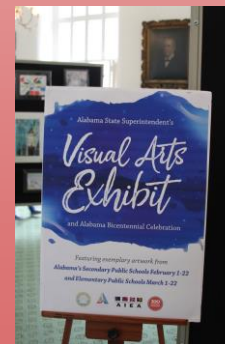

The local artwork consists of drawings, paintings, sculptures, and photographs. They can be seen until March 30 in the museum.

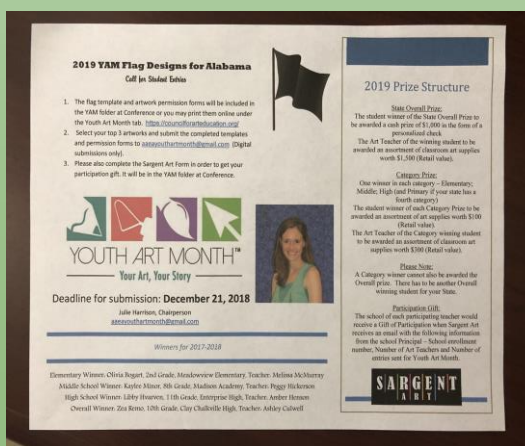
